

Molly K. Macauley. Dr. Macauley is a Senior Fellow with Resources for the Future (RFF) and Director of RFF's First Wednesday seminar series and academic fellowship programs. Her research interests include space economics and policy, the economics of new technologies, climate policy, and the use of economic incentives in environmental regulation. She has testified before Congress on numerous occasions and serves on many national level committees and panels including the National Research Council's Space Studies Board, the Climate Working Group of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, and the Earth Science Applications Analysis Group of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). In 1994, she was selected as one of the National Space Society's "Rising Stars," and in 2001 she was voted into the International Academy of Astronautics. She has received awards from NASA and the Federal Aviation Administration for her research. Macauley is also a visiting professor in the Department of Economics at Johns Hopkins University.
