About the program

A unique year-long Master's program has been created in Paris by one of France's most highly regarded universities, the Institut d'Études Politiques de Paris (**Sciences Po**).

The program awards a **Master's degree in Law** from Sciences Po ("Master Droit économique"). The aim of this highly selective, multi-disciplinary, and international program is to provide in-depth analysis of issues involved in the global market with a European perspective. It is designed to provide a comprehensive theoretical and practical approach to legal issues in a global context, whether from a perspective of international litigation and arbitration, of supranational economic governance, or as a matter of transnational advocacy in human rights cases. The more theoretically inclined will find exciting new areas for research on issues of global law and governance. Taught by experts from Sciences Po, the program involves interactive, bi-lingual discussion in small groups in which American students, will mingle with their European counterparts. Courses are taught in French and in English. Students will have the opportunity to take their courses in either language or in both of them.

Mention the courses that you will take and explain why you want to study at Sciences Po next year.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Proof of proficiency in French <p>Please note that you have the choice to take all your courses in English or to take some or all your courses in French. If you wish to take courses in French, an advanced level of proficiency in French is required: TCF minimum score 500 or DELF/DALF minimum score C1.</p> <p>Acceptable language proofs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - TFC results - OR DELF/DALF results

Courses	<p>Course topics include, among others: international business transactions and contracts, the World Trade Organization, international finance, international arbitration, intellectual property, General International Public Law, Theory of international law making, Global competition law, Global conflict of laws and cross-border litigation etc.</p> <p>More information available here.</p>

Visa information	<p>Students who are admitted to the program will need to apply for a visa. Before doing so, they must register with Campus France. Additional fees	<p>Since September 1st 2018, students registering at a third level establishment for the first time are no longer changing to an obligatory health insurance system for the reimbursement of their healthcare costs: they remain affiliated to their current social protection system, which is in general that of their parents, regardless of which system it is (general, agricultural, etc.).
