



Micro Grants to Develop International Legal Skills

Through this initiative, limited funding is available to support motivated Penn Carey Law students wishing to independently pursue skills development and network-building for globalized legal tracks. All applicants should identify opportunities that are explicitly international in nature.

Individual awards will not exceed \$500 per student. Students are eligible to receive no more than one grant per fiscal year (July 1 – June 30). Note: As this is not a scholarship program, we are unable to subsidize courses for which applicants will be receiving academic credit toward their degrees.
