



Certificate of Study in Environmental Policy

This certificate will be granted by the Institute for Environmental Studies at the University of Pennsylvania to Penn Law students who successfully complete its requirements.

To qualify for the certificate, a student must successfully complete five courses in the general area of Environmental Policy chosen from the list below.

Two of these courses are taken at the Law School, and three from a selection of courses in Environmental Studies.

I. Law School Courses

- a. Students must complete two courses in Environmental Law or Policy, from a list approved annually by the Associate Dean.

II. Environmental Policy Courses

- a. Students must complete three courses in Environmental Policy, from a list approved annually by the Director of Professional Programs of the IES Program.

III. Course Availability

- a. It is expected that most of the Environmental Policy courses will have openings for Law students in most years. In any given year, however, Law students cannot be assured of available spots in all Environmental Studies classes. As is true in the Law School, when a course is oversubscribed, instructors in Environmental Policy may give preference to students from their department.
- b. Students may substitute other courses as appropriate. The Associate Dean for Academic Affairs of the Law School, in consultation with the Director of Professional Education Programs of the IES Program, must approve courses other than those from the approved lists.
