Technology Law is an innovative and practical course intended to provide students with key legal and ethical principles that technology professionals and high-tech entrepreneurs need to know as they innovate and carry out their professional responsibilities. A distinctive feature of this course is that it presents issues from the bottom up, the way a practicing technologist would experience them, using real current and cutting-edge examples. Major topics will include the impact of potential liability of product design, differences when lifecritical systems are involved, privacy considerations, proper and improper uses of intellectual property, data, and the proper bounds of employment relationships. The course will also focus on in-depth classroom discussion exploring decision making in the face of multiple and ambiguous sources of normative obligations.
